Deputy Mayor Marguerite Phillips awarded the Mayor's trophy for best vehicle in show to a 1947 MG TC that had been lovingly restored by Ray Brand. At the Kite Festival President Peter Mitton awarded best vehicle

in show to a replica of a 1937 Jaguar SS100 owned and built from a kit by Paul Wright over a 3 year period. For those of you sharp enough to spot two different presidents giving prizes, that is because the Rotary year changes on July 1st.
